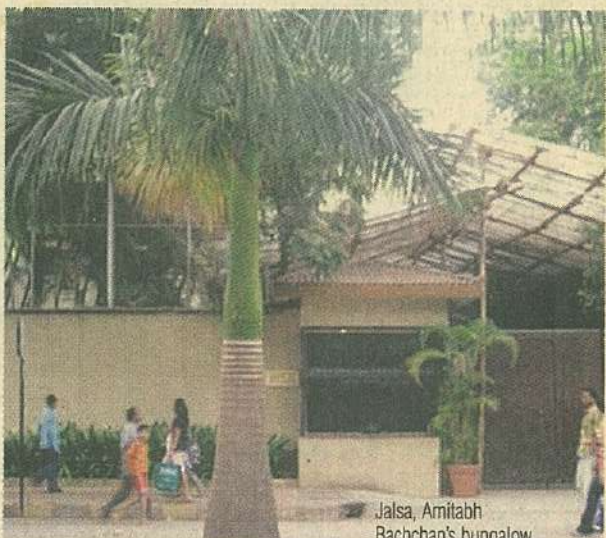


There's a lot in a name
